July in Michigan brings a focus on our greatest treasure: the Great Lakes. Recently, we traveled to Beaver Island for the **Smithsonian Water/Ways Exhibit**. It was an amazing experience with colleagues, Beaver Island residents, and many others who gathered to

share their collective experiences with water. Michigan Humanities scholar Dave Dempsey illuminated the critical nature of water in Michigan. Twenty percent of the world's fresh water supply (and 84% of the nation's) is in the Great Lakes. We are so proud to support the work of **Third Coast Conversations** (our grant program) around the topic of water, and the **Water/Ways** traveling exhibit. The Council has much on the horizon. We are beginning the selection process for a new **Great Michigan Read** book, and engaging in a **Listening Tour** across the state. 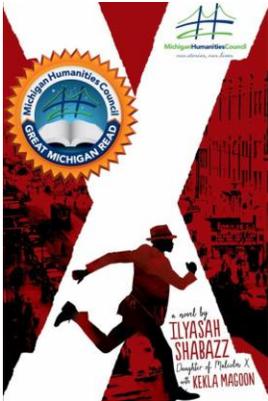

Discovery Days at the Leelanau County Poor Farm funded in part by a Michigan Humanities Quick Grant



The Leelanau County Historic Preservation Society was awarded a Quick Grant to support their "Discovery Days" at the Society's Poor Farm. "Discovery Days" will be held to identify and gather information from the public about personal experiences with the County Poor Farm; family stories, photos, journals, letters, and photographs. A celebratory historic reenactment of plowing the field at the Leelanau County Poor Farm took place on May 26, 2018. A second "Discovery Day" is planned for Saturday, July 28, from 10 a.m. to noon at Kasson Township Hall. The Coleman family (original managers of the Poor Farm) will be on hand to share stories and family photographs. The Historic Preservation Society has also partnered with Buckets of Rain to use the land for a community garden that will provide free food to local food pantries.
